What was Paul prepared to do on his third visit to Corinth?

How did Christ appear weak and then ultimately appear strong?

Read 2 Corinthians 13:7-10

Instead of discipline, what does Paul hope to do when he visits Corinth?

What does Paul mean in verse 9? Why would he be glad to be seen as weak?

Read 2 Corinthians 13:5-6

How does Paul put the Corinthians in a bit of a pickle by asking them to examine themselves?

Why is it a good practice to regularly examine the fruit in your life?
